# FASH 'Chat' – Our FASH Winter Gathering - How a Tradition Began ....

We will be holding our 4th annual Winter Gathering on the 14th December this year and I feel that I can now tentatively call it a tradition. As those of you who have come to any of the last three will know, it is a joyous Christmas party to celebrate all the music and dance and lovely people that we have in the folk world around Hampshire.

Like many of these serendipitous things, it began with our trying to find a solution to a problem. It was 2022 and we were looking for something original, but crucially not too expensive for our Do Something Different Day. Covid-induced lethargy and caution had reduced the numbers coming to workshops and so we needed something that wouldn't make a huge loss! You may remember that we had experimented with all sorts of things for our Do Something Different Day - playing the spoons, mime, playing drums, singing with Ramskyte and making up our own carols, sea shanties with the Portsmouth Shantymen and handbell ringing with our own dear Elizabeth to name but a few. They were very much enjoyed by those who came, but unfortunately not enough people came and they were particularly expensive to run, so they always ran at a loss.

So we thought why not have a party and charge much less than usual to encourage people to brave socialising again? We asked all our excellent local callers (some of whom

are nationally known) if they would call a couple of dances for us and enjoy the rest of the day for free. We tentatively asked our excellent musicians Pete and Sue, Pogles Copse and Claire, Judith and Rick whether they would be willing to play for a session each. To our great delight all the musicians as well as the callers agreed to come, so with great trepidation we set about planning our first Winter Gathering.

We needn't have worried. That inaugural party in 2022 was a great success. We had more than fifty people and so many of them commented as they left how much they had enjoyed it that we thought we should do it again! Since then we are lucky to have acquired Louise Siddons, Linda Game and Thomas Bending (all nationally popular) as very supportive local callers and musicians.

Two other elements of that first Gathering that have stayed until now are the Mummers Play and Terry Bristow's String Quartet. I can't remember who first suggested that we invite King John's Mummers, but they very kindly agreed to come after lunch and perform their play. It was much appreciated and the collection from the assembled audience came to more than £100 for their chosen charity. We were very proud of the generosity of our folk people! King John's Mummers have performed for the last 3 years, but this year we can watch the Prize Old Mummers while we

digest our various BYO lunches. I'm sure they will find people equally generous towards their chosen charity, although it's a bit more difficult now as people don't carry cash as they used to and may have to bring some especially for the mummers.

The String Quartet's history is unusual. Some of you may have met Terry Bristow, who plays in the Southampton Folk Orchestra and was one of Hampshire Garland's musicians. In his spare time over several years he made two violins, a viola and a cello! (In order to dry the varnish on the cello, he first had to build a drying cabinet to protect it from dust!) I felt that this achievement should be celebrated. so we found four fantastic musicians (including in the first year our own Jacqui Longhurst) to play the instruments at the Gathering. It made a pleasant break from the dancing, and they also played for a couple

of dances where we circled round them. People really liked them so we asked them back and we still have two of the original line up. They don't now all play Terry's instruments, but he still hosts the rehearsal. In the second year they asked if they could have a quick rehearsal while people were arriving, which actually set the festive atmosphere and was so popular we have asked them to come early ever since.

Ian Kirby was the Chair of our committee when he agreed to MC the first Gathering and he will hopefully be back this year. He has not been well so we have our fingers firmly crossed for him. We would all love as many of you as possible to come and enjoy the party! The hall will be decorated and the mince pies will be waiting .....

The clubs, both folk dance and folk are beginning to announce their programmes running into the New Year, so our on-line diaries are beginning to grow again. Some of the dance dates are still to be confirmed and a few caller details are still to be added, but generally the diary is correct. The folk club guests we shall add once the dates and details are posted on-line.

Chichester Folk Song Club's guests this month will be the Drywood Duo, appearing there on the 17th, but next month, the Christmas Party Night on the 22nd is a members only event.

If you are proposing to go along to Focsle Music's evenings on the 25th November or the 9th December, keep an eye on their website as on those two evenings, Saints are playing at home and it may be necessary to change what the folk club had planned.

While looking for something else completely different, I was reminded of a venue I often overlook – the Chapel Music Sessions take place at St Edwards Church in Netley. This month, on the 15th, Ray Cooper is appearing there; doors are open at 7.00 and the concert starts at 7.30 A bar is available in the Church Hall from 6.30, serving alcohol and teas and coffee and tickets are available from *eventbrite*.

In the same way, I discovered that The Brook in Portswood Road, Southampton is hosting a concert by Skerryvore on the 19th. Doors are open at 7.30 for an 8.00 start. Tickets from the box office (afternoons only, Wednesday to Saturday) or via their website.

.In September, you may remember, the Railway Inn held a fund-raising concert as the pub was at risk of closure. You may also recall that almost exactly two years ago The Platform Tavern in Southampton suffered a disastrous fire, and organised a series of fund-raising concerts to enable rebuilding and reopening. Even so, it has left them with a substantial backlog of mortgage repayments, and last month they held a concert to help save the pub from being repossessed by the bank. The second of these concerts is on the 7th of this month and is being held at The Brook in Portswood Road, Southampton. Neither concert is exactly folk, but the pub has frequently hosted folk sessions, and these two examples illustrate the rather parlous situation some of our venues are in. We mentioned last month the death of Graham Taylor; we heard too late to include a significant tribute to him. Anne Daw has written the following obituary:

#### Graham Taylor – Caller, Morris dancer and Rapper dancer – 1944 – 2025

Graham was born on 28th April 1944 in Orston, a village about 16 miles east of Nottingham. His sister, Brenda, does not recall that Graham showed an early interest in Morris Dancing but his musical taste was more 'folk' than 'rock', where he played Bob Dylan on an old-style tape recorder.

Graham studied Aeronautical Engineering at Loughborough, and thus started his career as an engineer, working for British Aerospace at Filton, Bristol and then Philips Semiconductors, where he worked for the rest of his career.

I met Graham in 1988 when I joined Philips Semiconductors in Malmesbury, Wiltshire. The department wrote software for a system to design integrated circuits, which was used at Philips sites worldwide. His interests at this time were motorbiking and sport, especially cricket and badminton. In 1991, we moved from the halcyon portakabin by the stream with the gentle aroma of muck-spreading, to the very different location of Millbrook, Southampton. This brought Graham to the south coast, where he settled in the village of Braishfield near Romsey.

In 1995, Simon and I got together with a few friends and started playing as a barn-dance band. We were asked to play for our first gig - a birthday party in Bournemouth - but we had no caller. We asked Graham and he enthusiastically said 'yes', so armed with the EFDSS Community Dance Manual, he called for his first barn-dance. He was a popular and busy caller, calling most weekends with our band, Pogles Wood, also Corn Town Troopers, Woodsiders, Rigs, Turk Tarantella and at local Folk Dance Clubs -Eastleigh and Waterlooville. Graham also called for the weekly FolkActive dances in Southampton and the FASH Schools' Ceilidh.

As well as a great caller, Graham loved dancing. He danced with Hursley International Dancers, Alton Morris, Hook Eagle Morris, and Dorset Buttons Rapper. He was dancing master for Silver Flame girl's rapper side.

Outside of folk, Graham's interests were mainly outdoors and sport. He used to walk, and loved mountains; he did the "Coast to Coast" walk and hiked all over the Lake District and Scotland. He was a keen cyclist, cycling daily from Braishfield to Millbrook, and longer routes such as the London to Brighton cycle ride, which he did with Simon, and then cycling home from Brighton!

Graham was a volunteer guide at Mottisfont for 12 years, where he often led the themed walks, e.g. on the history of Mottisfont.

Graham had his first operation for cancer, 18 years ago, and straight after recovery, retired from Philips. He explored the world, visiting amazing places, usually ending up in Australia to visit his daughter and grandchildren. Whether it was Portree or Bolivia, Graham liked to share his travels on Facebook. He also loved his camper van trips which usually involved a Folk Festival as part of the itinerary.

Graham was never happier than going to Folk Festivals – Sidmouth, Chippenham, Swanage – chatting to all the lovely people he had met through folk.

Our local display sides are now well into their practice season, so little in the way of danceouts to mention. Look out, however, around Christmas and the New Year when several sides may well brave whatever weather there is and dance at one of the area's pubs.

From what I hear, several of the area's Morris sides are steadily growing, which is good news. Mafficking Border Morris have increased in numbers quite considerably since they were founded only a year or so ago in Portsmouth. I gather that Wickham Morris gained five new members this year and Sarum Morris, who perhaps a decade ago were quite tight for numbers, can now boast twenty dancers – more than enough for two dance sets when they are out.

It seems that some people around us, even those who are part of the 'folk scene', still have not really heard about FASH and what we do. I gather that quite recently someone was bemoaning the lack of a map of Hampshire showing all the locations where folk activities take place. Fortunately, the person he was talking to was very familiar with FASH, our publications and our website, particularly as he put together the map that we now use on the website and which can be found on the sub-menu below the "Clubs" item on the menu bar - "Find a local club". The map is fairly interactive, so you can select a marker colour appropriate to what you are looking for and then find the markers in your area, or you can open the table (click on the icon to the left of the

word "FASH" at the top left of the table), and then click on the venue or club you are trying to find. Most markers, when you click on them, reveal a link which will either take you to the relevant entry on our website, or to the venue's website.
