FASH 'Chat' - When It All Started...

Twenty years ago, I wrote the FASH Chat for the Christmas and New Year issue of Solent Waves, taking about Mummers, Morris dancing, seasonal festivities at Cecil Sharp House and a bit about what happened to Cecil Sharp in Headington, Oxfordshire, on Boxing Day 1899. I was reminded of that article recently when my good friend Julie Kimber-Nickelson died. Her grandfather was William Kimber.

Many of the men in Headington Quarry quarries, masonry worked in the bricklaying trades, and the women did laundry for the Oxford colleges. The winter of 1899 was harsh and by Boxing Day, with work being scarce and money very short, the men who danced the traditional Morris decided to go out to earn an honest penny by dancing. In those days the collection, or bag, was split between the men, providing some muchneeded extra income. There is a recorded tradition of Morris dancing in Quarry going back to the early 1700s, and the men had been persuaded to revive the dances fully earlier in 1899, so the dancers of Headington Quarry, led by their musician William Kimber, were ready to 'dance out'. One of their dance spots was Sandfield Cottage in Headington, where the folk musicologist Cecil Sharp - who hitherto had been unaware of the survival of this native form of dancing – was staying with his in-laws. He was aware of music and songs, but this was something different.

Six of the men formed into two lines of three in front of the house. Kimber struck up a tune on his concertina, and the men began with some of their familiar repertoire; 'Bean Setting' (a dance that involves the thumping and clashing of sticks), 'Laudnum Bunches' (a dance of springs and capers, and lots of waving and swinging of handkerchiefs) and 'Trunkles' (a dance of high jumps and kicking each other's feet in mock challenge). Cecil Sharp was amazed and entranced and insisted that William Kimber should come back the next day to play the tunes so that he could write them down. So began a lifelong friendship. And this is when and where the whole modern folk revival started!

Cecil Sharp toured Oxfordshire, Somerset and other regions of England, and eventually of course outside of England, looking for traditional songs, dances and tunes that he could record for posterity. He often took William Kimber with him on lecture tours, to demonstrate dances and play the tunes, or invited him to work with him in London, as did others involved in the folk revival, like Mary Neal. Cecil Sharp and those others founded the English Folk Dance and Song Society. William Kimber danced and played all over the country, including at the Royal Albert Hall and in front of King Edward VII and Queen Alexandra. And Headington Quarry Morris Dancers continue to dance the dances to the tunes that William Kimber played.

William Kimber taught Morris at the local schools until his death in 1961. His granddaughter Julie inherited his concertina after he died, her husband Alan and son Chris danced with Headington Quarry Morris Dancers and Chris still does. William Kimber has been honoured in many ways over the

years, and it's interesting to think that if he and his friends hadn't been feeling purse-pinched at Christmas in 1899, we might not be dancing now.



It is fun (why else would so many people do it?), it is good exercise, and it is not as if you would be "on show" all on your own (unless you really want to dance Morris jigs right from the start) but will have a team around you and someone telling you what comes next.

When I am hunting around, mainly using the internet, to find what is on in our area each month, I am amazed at just how much music is being made all around us and how many different genres of music there are available to us. Folk is just a relatively small part, but even then, where do I draw the line; when you have terms like alt-folk, and folk rock it is difficult to know what to include in the diary listings. You could argue that American Country is a form of American folk music... I tend not to include folk music from overseas as our diaries could so easily become long and generally unhelpful to readers who are looking for more traditional British folk music.

So what is on in some of the venues we do not usually include in the diary? Chris While and Julie Matthews are appearing at the Square Tower in Portsmouth, but sadly this concert is sold out. However, a week or so later Sorrel Nation is taking the stage there on the 2nd of November.

The Levellers are performing at the Guildhall in Southampton on the 12th November, and are supported there by Grace Petrie – a folk rock concert in the middle of many other music types. Similarly you find folk concerts surrounded by many other types of entertainment at the Wedgwood Rooms in Portsmouth – at the end of November on the 30th they are hosting the Sandy Denny Project, a band of six musicians keeping Sandy's music alive. Just a few days later, on the 4th December, Seth Lakeman in on stage, then a week after that on the 10th, St. Agnes Fountain take the stage (it is suggested you book soon, as

apparently their Christmas Tour last year was sold out).

Chichester Folk song club have yet to announce their October programme but their present poster mentions Winter Wilson as "coming soon". Winter Wilson's website confirms that in fact they will be in Chichester on Monday the 27th.

Not far away, on the Bognor Road, the Brick Kiln Garden Centre are again holding events, and on the 25th November: The Portsmouth Shantymen are appearing there, the concert starting at 3.30 (doors open at 3.00). Tickets are available via their website and include a Festive Cream Tea.

We are delighted, of course, that our own series of workshops restart this month, with Mike Courtold joining us for the day on the 19th. Pogles Copse will be accompanying him on stage to keep us in time, with their music.

Behind the scenes we are already planning the workshops for FASH's 2026/2027 season. Yes, we really have to plan that for ahead – dance callers are in great demand, and for many, their diaries cover at least two years into the future. We have booked several callers and most of the bands; the halls have also been booked and all the dates and venues are on our website's 'Workshops' page, www.fash.org.uk/workshops.htm, in the section hidden behind the words "Read more" just below this season's diary. You may need to double click rather than single click on the words to open this section.

I have to apologise to Daphne our secretary for accidentally transferring her responsibility for booking bands for our workshops to Karen Ilott – Karen books our halls and callers.

If you are a regular attendee, or used to be, of the Southam Gathering, or are hoping to go next year, you will be interested to hear that changes are afoot. Having lost the use of the main venue – The Grange – and only having two smaller halls to use which were several miles apart, it was clear that a new location/new venues would need to be found. There is a new committee, led by Victoria and Dave Yeomans, which is planning next year's event. We understand the location will be fairly close to Southam but the details have yet to be confirmed. A case of "Watch this space" for when we hear more.

We end, unfortunately, on a more sombre note: we heard, only just in time to include it in this issue, that Graham Taylor died on the 19th September after a long battle with cancer. I

remember him particularly as one of the founders of the FASH Schools' Ceilidh, for which he called for some years. I saw him quite often dancing with Dorset Buttons Rapper team, and also, on one occasion wearing a skirt (at Chippenham Folk Festival), supporting the (young) ladies Rapper side 'Silver Flame', for which he was the dancing master. We hope to have a much more comprehensive tribute to Graham in next month's 'Solent Waves'.
